Day One: Meet & Greet and The Hill of Tara

Driving time: 2 hours

Driving time: 2.5 hours

First port of call is the Titanic museum, where the finest ship on the seven seas was once built.

Day Three: Belfast to Derry

Driving time: 2 hours

Next on the list is UNESCO World Heritage site, The Giants Causeway, steeped in legend and natural beauty, this place is a paradise for hikers and photographers.

Only a short drive away is Dunlunce Castle, perched on a cliff face, this ruin of a castle is a sight to behold as we wonder who's footsteps passed before us.

We make our way to Derry city for the evening, Irelands only remaining walled city.





Day Four: Derry to Donegal

Driving time: 2.5 hours

Waking up full of energy and enthusiasm we get straight into a walking tour of Derry city, this stroll around the walled city gives you all the information you could want about the history of the town, learn about Bloody Sunday, the Apprentice Boys and much more.

Leaving Northern Ireland behind, we head for the wild county of Donegal and in the heart of it is Glenveagh National Park, where we will explore the beautiful manicured gardens contrasted with wilderness it is situated in.

Meandering through the hills of Donegal we are making our way to our first village stay of the tour, where we will find the best locals to chat to, the finest crafts and maybe some traditional Irish music.





Day Five: Donegal to Sligo

Driving time: 3.5 hours

Day Six: Sligo to Galway

Driving time: 3 hours
